## Character - Lesson 14 Thorough

Note: The practical applications provided in the lesson are offered as suggestions to help the saints in their preparation. They are not meant to direct or limit the ways in which the focus of the lesson can be applied. The saints are encouraged to pray and contact the Lord to receive His burden and guidance in teaching and applying the lesson. Fellowship with other saints, and inquiring of the children themselves, may also bring out many helpful applications.

## Lesson:

Verse: "And when Moses finished writing the words of this law in a book until they were completed"

(Deuteronomy 31:24).

Focus: A thorough person is someone who completes what needs to be done. They do not stop

halfway but will continue until the task is complete.

Practical Application: Consider telling the story of Moses writing the law according to Jehovah's commandments. Moses did not stop halfway or complain of being too tired to finish the task. Give several examples to the children about completing tasks. When asked to tidy your room, you should pick up *all* clothing off the floor, not just *most* of the clothing. When looking for a missing library book, do not give up, but keep looking in every possible place until the book is found. If given a list of things to do, you should not give up and go do something else until you have completed all the items on the list.
